



Centercourt COVID Safety Procedures

All procedures are subject to change based on CDC and Health Department recommendations.

Prior to Centercourt camp attendance:

- All staff, counselors, campers, and coaches will be required to complete at home temperature checks prior to arriving at the facility each day. If there is an elevation in temperature (<100.4) the individual will be required to stay home and to alert the camp director.
- All staff, counselors, campers, and coaches will be required to complete a second temperature screening during check-in by Centercourt staff. All results will be documented daily. Any staff, counselors, campers, coaches that have an elevated temperature (<100.4) will not be allowed to attend camp that day and must be reported to the camp director.
- Visitors will be restricted at all times. No spectators or parents will be permitted to stay and observe.

Drop off and Pick up

- **Drop-off:** Each age/sport group will be assigned a staggered designated time slot to arrive in order to minimize traffic. All parents/guardians are asked to remain in their vehicles until given a signal after temperature screening. Each camper will then be escorted to their individual group zones.
- **Pick-up:** Each group will be assigned a staggered designated pick-up time. Campers will wait in their individual group zones with their counselor until their name is called and they are escorted to their car. Parents/guardians are instructed to stay in their cars and utilize name placards to expedite pick-up. Any pick-up person will be documented during camper registration.
- **Exemptions:** During initial registration, parents will be permitted to exit their cars when called upon to submit required paperwork. Parents/guardians of the pre-k groups will be permitted to escort their campers along a designated path to their individual group zone.

Equipment

- All campers are required to bring their own bag that is closable and easy to transport by the camper.
- Campers are required to bring a water bottle, face mask, towel, and sunscreen on a daily basis.
- All campers planning on swimming are encouraged to wear their swimsuits to camp.
- All sports equipment will be sanitized in between each individual and group usage.

Dining

- Meal times will be staggered based on age, sport, and location.
- Within their designated groups, campers will be provided individually packaged lunches.
- Campers with dietary restrictions are required to bring their own individually packaged lunch.
- Groups will remain in their designated zones while their counselor will retrieve their lunches in order to reinforce social-distancing protocols.

Social-Distancing

- All staff, counselors, campers, and coaches will remain in the same group throughout the entirety of camp.
- Counselors, groups, and staff will maintain and encourage social-distancing whenever possible.
- Masks will be required during activities where social-distancing is not possible.

Sanitation and Hygiene

- The facility will have hand-sanitizing and hand-washing stations at several locations throughout the property.
- Daily cleaning, sanitation, and disinfection of all surfaces and equipment will be completed by a professional cleaning staff.
- Daily cleaning and wipe-downs of congregation areas, surfaces, and equipment will be performed throughout the day and in between uses by a professional cleaning staff.
- Staff and counselors will be trained to sanitize all equipment in between campers' usage throughout the day.

Identification of Possible COVID-19 Cases

- In the event that any staff, counselor, camper, or coach experiences any symptoms, they will be quarantined in the designated isolation area and be required to wear a mask.
- All camper's parents/guardians will be contacted and instructed to pick up their campers immediately.
- Staff will be instructed to leave immediately.
- The Camp Director will contact the Pequannock Health Department and the New Jersey State Health Department to receive instructions.
- 24 hours after a possible positive case, a deep cleaning of the entire facility will occur.
- Camp will follow all direction and re-open in accordance with local health authority orders.
